Virtually/Very/Each everyone in the developed world has heard of the famous - or rather **infamous/unfamous/ imfamous** - passenger liner *The Titanic*. Even those who have not watched the movie probably know the ship **sink/sunk/sank** in mid-Atlantic and took thousands of people to a watery grave.

What is less well known is that this ship was built in Comber, near Belfast. Indeed, part of the city's docklands have been transformed into its **so-called/such/for instance** Titanic Quarter, and the Titanic Belfast Museum is the **jewellery/jaw/jewel** in its crown. It is a **relative/relatively/reliably** young building, designed by the architect Eric Kuhne and only opened to the public in 2012.
