
Dear Readers.

JADED

<u>jaded</u> – no longer interested in something, showing no <u>enthusiasm</u> about something, because of having too much of it.

Even the most jaded of listeners were <u>enchanted by</u> her voice and poise.

jaded | znudzony, znużony, przesycony enthusiasm ɪn'θju:ziæzəm | entuzjazm enchanted by sth | oczarowany, urzeczony czymś



FURIOUS

furious – very angry

Mary was furious with me when she learnt I had lent George all my savings.

furious 'fjʊəriəs | wściekły savings | oszczędności




ANXIOUS

anxious – worried and slightly nervous

 $\underline{Taking\ into\ account}$ recent events, he is seriously anxious about the future and his own safety.

anxious | zaniepokojony, niespokojny to take sth into account | brać coś pod uwagę



INDIFFERENT

<u>indifferent</u> - showing no interest in something, not being <u>sympathetic</u> towards someone

It's impossible to remain indifferent to the atrocity of their situation, when you see how they suffer and struggle every day.

indifferent | obojętny sympathetic ,sɪmpə'θetɪk | empatyczny, okazujący współczucie



cross - angry

You can't be cross with Benjamin for long. He is such a cute child.

cross | rozzłoszczony




ENVIOUS

<u>envious</u> - unhappy and angry <u>due to</u> not having something that someone else has or not being able to do something that someone else is able to do

You know very well that your cousin has always been envious of your academic <u>achievements</u> as well as your good <u>looks</u>.

envious 'envios | zazdrosny, zawistny due to sth | z powodu czegoś achievement | osiągnięcie looks | wygląd




CONCEITED

conceited - showing others your <u>superiority</u> over them <u>in terms of</u> looks, intelligence, financial status

Why did you invite Itelen to your birthday party? She is such a conceited person. She will spoil all the fun.

conceited kən'si:ttd | zarozumiały, wyniosły superiority | wyższość in terms of sth | pod względem czegoś to spoil sth | zepsuć coś



IN LOVE

(to be) in love - to love someone

I think I'm in love. I can't eat, I can't sleep, I can't stop thinking of her.

to be in love | być zakochanym



SUSPICIOUS

<u>suspicious</u> - believing that someone else cannot be trusted; <u>suspecting</u> that the person might have done something wrong

The man's <u>behaviour</u> at the airport was highly suspicious. No wonder the police wanted to talk to him.


suspicious | podejrzany to suspect that... | podejrzewać, że... behaviour | zachowanie



innocent - with little experience of life

I remember Agatha when she moved to New York. Unlike now, she was such an innocent girl.

innocent 'inasnt | niewinny



RELIEVED

relieved - relaxed and happy

I felt <u>unbelievably</u> relieved when I saw everyone was safe after the hurricane.

relieved | odczuwający ulgę unbelievably ,^nbɪ'li:vəbli | niewiarygodnie



CHEERFUL

cheerful - very happy, optimistic, smiling a lot

You sister is the most cheerful person I've ever met. I love <u>hanging out</u> with her.

cheerful | radosny
to hang out with sb | spotykać się z kimś



FATIGUED

fatigued - very tired

They were fatigued and <u>famished</u> after the whole day of rock climbing.

fatigued fə'ti:gd | bardzo zmęczony, strudzony famished | głodny jak wilk




SERENE

serene - calm and peaceful

Tom is such a great pilot, the is always serene and <u>level-headed</u>, Passengers can feel safe with him,

serene səˈriːn | spokojny level-headed | zrównoważony




BITCHY

bitchy - rude, unkind towards other people

Stop being bitchy towards this waiter. It's not his fault that you aren't enjoying the meal.

bitchy | jędzowaty, złośliwy, wredny




EMBARRASSED

<u>embarrassed</u> – feeling <u>ashamed</u> and worried about what people might think of you

<u>Performing</u> in public makes me feel embarrassed.

embarrassed Im'bærəst | zawstydzony, zakłopotany

ashamed | zawstydzony performing | występowanie



livid – extremely angry

I've never seen him so livid. We need to find him $\underline{\text{otherwise}}$ something bad might happen.

livid | wściekły otherwise | w przeciwnym razie



SYMPATHETIC

<u>sympathetic</u> – showing empathy and kindness towards someone in trouble; willing to help someone in need

I can always <u>count on</u> you and ask you for advice. You've always been such a sympathetic and <u>faithful</u> friend.

sympathetic ,simpə'θetik | okazujący współczucie, empatyczny to count on sb | liczyć na kogoś faithful | wierny, oddany



MYSTERIOUS

mysterious – secretive, not liking to talk about personal issues

The <u>count</u> living in the castle on the hill is a very mysterious man. Noone knows what secrets he is hiding.

mysterious | tajemniczy count kaont | hrabia



RESENTFUL

<u>resentful</u> – <u>bitter</u>, <u>upset</u> and angry due to a conviction that something unjust has happened

He's been so resentful since he wasn't promoted.

resentful | dotknięty, obrażony bitter | zgorzkniały upset | w złym humorze to be promoted | dostać awans English Matters 67 2017



<u>confused</u> – unable to think in a clear way, unable to concentrate and take a decision

I was so confused. I couldn't decide who was telling the truth, or differentiate friend from foe.

confused | zdezorientowany foe fəʊ | wróg



THANKFUL

thankful - grateful for something

When you looked at the patient you could see that he was thankful for being taken care of.

thankful | wdzięczny



STRESSED

stressed - worried, feeling under pressure

You need to be patient with your brother. He's been extremely stressed recently with so much on his plate.

stressed | zestresowany



PISSED OFF

pissed off - (colloquial, BrE) angry, annoyed

What has happened to you? Why are you so pissed off?

pissed off | pot. wkurzony, wnerwiony

Did you know?

In American English, <u>instead of</u> 'pissed off' <u>in order to</u> <u>convey</u> the same meaning you'd just say you were 'pissed', which in British English means you were 'drunk'.

instead of sth | zamiast czegoś in order to | aby, żeby to convey sth | przekazać coś drunk | pijany



DROWSY

<u>drowsy</u> – <u>slightly</u> sleepy

You shouldn't drive a car when you take this medicine. It will make you feel drowsy.

drowsy | śpiący slightly | lekko, trochę




TIPSY

<u>tipsy</u> – slightly drunk

Do you feel tipsy after drinking one <u>pint</u> of bee??

tipsy | wstawiony, podchmielony pint paint | miara piwa, pinta



MISERABLE

miserable - extremely unhappy and sad

I'm afraid you won't be able to help her. We've already tried everything. She's been so miserable since the accident.

miserable 'mızrəbl | nieszczęśliwy



EXASPERATED

<u>exasperated</u> – very upset

She gave me an exasperated look when I mentioned her ex-husband.

exasperated | rozdrażniony, zdenerwowany



gloomy – sad and depressed

You shouldn't be so gloomy. Losing a job isn't the end of the world.

gloomy | przygnębiony



nosy - wanting to know everything, asking a lot of questions
| agree that he is a nice and cheerful person. If only he wasn't so nosy!
nosy | wścibski



SPEECHLESS

<u>speechless</u> – not able to say anything due to a feeling of surprise or anger

Her bitter <u>remarks</u> about my performance left me speechless.

speechless | oniemialy
remark | uwaga



GUILTY

guilty – feeling responsible for doing something wrong, feeling ashamed

I feel really guilty that I could not come to your wedding.

guilty | winny wedding | ślub



DISGUSTED

<u>disgusted</u> – very upset and angry

We were all disgusted by his <u>violent</u> behaviour.

disgusted dis'gAstid | zniesmaczony violent | gwałtowny



FRUSTRATED

frustrated – impatient and annoyed

He gets frustrated when he has to explain the same thing twice.

frustrated | sfrustrowany




hostile – unfriendly and angry, behaving in a threatening way

The politician was really hostile when he was asked about the <u>rumours</u> of his <u>affair</u> with the secretary.

hostile 'hostaɪl | wrogo nastawiony

rumour 'ru:mə(r) | plotka

affair | romans




ZEALOUS

zealous – showing a lot of enthusiasm towards something

He is a zealous <u>supporter</u> of this mysterious religious group. I'm really afraid that something bad might happen to him.


zealous | żarliwy, zagorzały, podchodzący do czegoś z entuzjazmem **supporter |** zwolennik



sly – clever and cunning

Don't be deceived - she is the sliest person you'll ever meet.

sly | przebiegły
deceived di'si:vd | oszukany



STERN

stern - very serious

I couldn't bear her stern look. I felt as if it was burning a hole in my head.

stern | surowy



OVERJOYED

overjoyed – very happy

He was overjoyed to be able to walk again.

overjoyed | rozradowany




INQUISITIVE

inquisitive – asking a lot of questions, curious about things

James is a very inquisitive child, he wants to know about everything.

inquisitive In'kwIZƏTIV | dociekliwy



COURAGEOUS

courageous - very brave

Thor is regarded as a strong and courageous Norse god.

courageous kəˈreɪdʒəs | odważny, śmiały Norse | nordycki



DIZZY

<u>dizzy</u> – unable to stand without difficulty due to the impression that everything around you is <u>spinning</u>

I feel really dizzy. I need to sit down. Can you bring me some water?

dizzy | cierpiący na zawroty głowy to spin | kręcić się



OBSTINATE

obstinate - stubborn, unwilling to change one's mind

Don't be so obstinate! I really want to help you.

obstinate 'pbstɪnət | uparty



BEWILDERED

bewildered – extremely confused

We were all bewildered by his sudden decision to leave the country.

bewildered | zdumiony, oszołomiony, skonsternowany



TIMID

timid - shy, lacking confidence

It is difficult to believe that he was such a timid child. Now, he is such a great performer.


timid | nieśmiały



OFFENDED

<u>offended</u> – angry with someone because of what they said or did I felt deeply offended when she said I was lazy.

offended | obrażony



DETACHED

<u>detached</u> – reserved, not feeling <u>involved in</u> something

Her detached look really worried me. The <u>illness</u> was taking her away from us.

detached dr'tætʃt | zdystansowany, obojętny involved in sth | zaangażowany w coś illness | choroba




NEUROTIC

neurotic - excessively anxious or concerned

Your recent behaviour <u>seems</u> a bit neurotic. Is everything all right?

neurotic | neurotyczny
to seem | wydawać się



CARELESS

<u>careless</u> – not careful enough, not paying attention to details

She is so careless! She left the door open again.

careless | beztroski, niefrasobliwy



FLATTERED

<u>flattered</u> – pleased because someone said something nice about you

She felt extremely flattered when he paid her another compliment.

flattered | mile połechtany czymś, taki któremu jest miło (np. z powodu komplementu)



HUMILIATED

<u>humiliated</u> – feeling ashamed and embarrassed by someone

I hate being humiliated in front of a <u>crowd</u>.

humiliated | poniżony, upokorzony
crowd | tłum
