

Subject: Three-word phrasal verbs – Memo Game

Lay the cards face down. Shuffle the cards.

The first player turns over two cards. If they match, the player keeps them. If they don't, he/she needs to turn them back over in the same place on the table. All the players try to remember what was on the cards that have been turned over.

Then, another player turns over one card. He/She tries to find a match for his card. He/She turns the second card over.

The game is over when the players have collected all the pairs of cards.

The winner is the player with the most pairs.
